

2023 Panelist and Arbiter Remuneration Rates

In accordance with NWPTA Schedule 5, Panelist Remuneration, there is an annual inflationary increase linked to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rate from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

(Remuneration increase linked to 2022 CPI rate: 6.3% (Statistics Canada))

Panelist Remuneration

Paragraph 3: Individuals sitting as panelists are entitled to charge up to a maximum of \$142.90 per hour, to a maximum of \$1143.19 per day for all work, not including travel time, required to be undertaken by them while carrying out their duties as panelists, commencing as of the time they are officially appointed to a dispute settlement panel constituted under Part IV.

Paragraph 4: Individuals sitting as panelists are entitled to charge up to a maximum of \$71.66 per hour, to a maximum of \$571.55 per day, for any travel that is required to be undertaken by them as part of their duties as panelists, commencing as of the time they are officially appointed to a dispute settlement panel constituted under Part IV.

In accordance with NWPTA Division C: Bid Protest Mechanism, Schedule 3 Operational Cost Awards Article 7(5), Arbiter Remuneration, there is an annual inflationary increase linked to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rate from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

Paragraph 3: Individuals sitting as arbiters are entitled to charge up to a maximum of \$142.90 per hour, to a maximum of \$1143.19 per day for all work required to be undertaken by them while carrying out their duties as arbiter, commencing as of the time they are officially appointed to a Bid Protest constituted under this Division C: Bid Protest Mechanism.
